

LOVELAND ART IN PUBLIC PLACES COMMUNITY ART GRANTS



In direct response to the Covid pandemic, Loveland Art in Public Places is offering art grants to artists and arts organizations wishing to produce works of art within the Loveland community. This grant program provides financial support to projects using the arts as their primary means of expression. Diversity of media and creative artistic expression is encouraged. Funds must be used for specific projects that are on display or leave evidence of the "happening" for a minimum of 30 days. (Please note that the term "Project" refers to performance-based events (honoring social distancing), community and individual art projects, exhibits, etc.)

Art in Public Places: Art Grant Goals

- ✚ To support artists and arts organizations
- ✚ To have a positive impact on residents and visitors to Loveland
- ✚ To enhance our community identity as a vital arts community
- ✚ To enhance the quality of life within Loveland
- ✚ To integrate a diversity of cultural expressions and voices

Eligibility Requirements

- ❖ Applicants may request up to \$5,000 for a project.
- ❖ Projects must primarily focus on artistic expression.
- ❖ Individuals or organizations may apply. 501c (3) status is not required in order to apply.
- ❖ Applications are accepted year-round, provided funds are available.
- ❖ In 2023, \$14,000 has been allocated by the Visual Arts Commission.
- ❖ Applicants must complete the application and submit all materials at once for jury review. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
- ❖ All application materials must be delivered to the Loveland Museum, 503 N. Lincoln Avenue, Loveland, CO 80537.

Overview

- ✚ Projects must take place anywhere within Loveland City limits and should have high visibility.
 - ✚ Applicants must have an easement or written permission for projects hosted on private property.
 - ✚ Projects to be on display or performed in City right-of-way must have Visual Arts Commission approval.
 - ✚ Funding consideration will be given to projects across a variety of artistic disciplines including visual arts.
 - ✚ Monies will be awarded based upon the suitability of the project to the project goals and the availability of funds to support the proposed endeavor.
 - ✚ Funds must be used for specific projects that are on display or leave evidence of the "happening" for a minimum of 30 days.
 - ✚ Grants will be reviewed by a committee and will be ranked as part of a competitive process.
 - ✚ The Loveland Art in Public Places program logo must be listed as a sponsor of projects awarded funds.
 - ✚ Awardees will enter into an agreement with the City prior to the dispersing of grant funds.
 - ✚ A final grant report will be provided to awardees to be completed within 30 days after the completion of the project.
 - ✚ Multiple grants will be considered; however, the VAC reserves the right to not fund all projects. The VAC will determine the amount to be paid on grant requests.
 - ✚ Community reach and the perceived ability to execute the project will also be considered.
 - ✚ Submit your application one of two ways:
 - 1) Materials may be submitted in hard copy to the Loveland Museum, 503 N. Lincoln Avenue, **or**
